 - b. The recipient(s) name(s)
 - c. Greeting
- 2. Prayer, Blessing or Thanksgiving
- 3. The Body of the Letter (what the sender wants to say that occasioned the letter)
 - a. Initial Exhortation
 - b. Thesis Statement
 - c. Theological Discussion
 - d. Practical/Ethical Admonitions
- 4. The Closing of the Letter
 - a. Practical matters
 - b. Individual Final Greetings
 - c. Farewell
